Goodwill Industries, 5847 West Saginaw

- Accepts all household furniture in good condition except baby furniture.
- Upholstered items should have no stains or odors and there should be no burns, rips or tears.
- Wooden items should not be broken or chipped.
- Will pick up items or can be dropped off.

Salvation Army, 5206 West Saginaw

- Accepts household furniture in good condition.
- Furniture should be free of stains or rips and be in generally good condition.
- Furniture should also be free of odors and there should be no broken or missing pieces.
- Will pick up items or can be dropped off. Call 800 562-3834 for pick up.

Volunteers of America, 5411 South Cedar

(517) 272-1600

- Accepts all household furniture in good condition except metal desks.
- Furniture should be in relatively good condition, no tears, stains.
- Items should be complete and not broken.
- Will pick up items at home or can be dropped off.

Valueland-World Mission, 5400 South Cedar

- Accept all small household appliances in good working condition.
- Accept working electronics and computers less than 4 years old.
- Accept books in good condition except encyclopedias and textbooks.
- Will pick up items at home or can be dropped off.

Bulk items are collected on Mondays. Residents must call the 24-hour number, 351-4999, or the DPW during business hours, 337-9459, to schedule a collection. Calls must be received by 7:30 a.m. on Monday for collection that day. Bulk item stickers may be purchased at City Hall or at the Public Works office during business hours.

Looking to recycle?

Cardboard and Boxboard Recycling

Corrugated cardboard and boxboard can be recycled at the City's drop off recycling sites, 1800 East State Road or 841 Timberlane. Boxboard items include cereal boxes, shoe/shirt/gift boxes, pasta boxes, paper towel rolls etc. Some boxboard items cannot be recycled including those that are wax coated (milk containers) and any boxboard item that is stored in the refrigerator or freezer.
